

Meriwether Lewis, William Clark

History of the Expedition

1814. The cornerstone of American exploration: first edition of the Lewis and Clark expedition, the definitive account of the most important exploration of the North American continent. Two volumes in contemporary calf, complete with the extraordinary large folding map.

F. Scott Fitzgerald *The Great Gatsby*

1925. One of the great rarities in American literature: first edition in the first-issue dust jacket of one of the most desirable works in modern literature.

Alexander Hamilton, James Madison,

John Jay The Federalist Papers

1788. "The most influential American political work." First edition of one of the seminal books in American political history, "a powerful influence in procuring the adoption of the Federal Constitution."

Mark Twain

The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn

1885. "All modern literature comes from one book by Mark Twain. It's the best book we've had" (Ernest Hemingway). An extraordinary American rarity: *Mark Twain's own copy of Huck Finn, signed by him*, in publisher's sheep. Full first issue, one of the earliest known copies.

William Harvey *On the Blood*

1653. "The most important single medical work ever published." Scarce first edition in English of Harvey's revolutionary work on the circulation of blood.

Karl Marx Capital: A Critical Analysis of Capitalist Production

1886. First edition in English of Marx's magnum opus, *Das Kapital*.


Marcus Aurelius *Meditations*

1634. "The most human of all books." First edition of the first English translation of the Stoic philosopher's influential teachings on human virtues.

Ernest Shackleton

Heart of the Antarctic WITH: The Antarctic Book 1909. Superb deluxe first edition, special limited large-paper issue of Shackleton's riveting account of the British expedition of 1907-1909, with The Antarctic Book, with the signatures of every member of the shore party, including Shackleton.





Alexander the Great by Quintus Curtius

The Life of Alexander the Great

1553. Exceedingly rare edition in English of this classic biography of Alexander the Great, in handsome 18th-century morocco-gilt.

Edward Gibbon

The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire 1776-88. "The greatest historical work ever written." Full first edition set of one of the great classics of Western thought, with folding maps. Six quarto volumes, finely bound in contemporary calf-gilt.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart *Don Giovanni* 1801. First edition of the full score of Mozart's magnificent opera.

Samuel Johnson

Dictionary of the English Language 1755. First edition of the first great dictionary of the English language, two large thick folio volumes in contemporary calf. **Charles Darwin** *On the Origin of Species*

1859. "The most important single work in science." First edition in original cloth, one of only 1250 copies printed. An exceptional copy.

John Milton *Paradise Lost*

1668. "One of the greatest, most noble and sublime poems which either this age or nation has produced." First edition of Milton's masterpiece, in contemporary calf.

Herman Melville *Moby-Dick*

1851. "Towards thee I roll, thou all-destroying but unconquering whale..." First American edition of Melville's superb classic, arguably the greatest single work in American literature.

William Shakespeare

Comedies, Histories, and Tragedies

1632. "Incomparably the most important work in the English language." Very rare 1632 Second Folio of Shakespeare's plays, among the most desirable of any English language books and the prize of any collection.

Thomas Jefferson *Memoires de Maximilien de Bethune, Duc de Sully*

1767. Thomas Jefferson's copy of the memoirs of the Duke de Sully, with Jefferson's ownership initials handwritten by him in each of the eight volumes.



Charles Dickens A Christmas Carol 1843. "The one great Christmas myth of modern literature." First edition, first issue. A beautiful copy.
